Mission Ready:MRC GEM Volunteers in Action


MRC GEM volunteers gathered on July 19 for an accelerated 3-hour training designed to build foundational emergency response knowledge. The course condensed content from FEMA's IS-100, IS-200, and IS-700 independent study programs, offering participants a fast-paced, hands-on introduction to the core principles of the Incident Command System (ICS) and the National Incident Management System (NIMS).

Attendees explored key concepts such as the structure and roles within ICS, including chain of command, span of control, and leadership strategies critical in real-world emergencies. The training also provided insight into how NIMS integrates coordination across local, state, tribal, and federal response efforts. This essential training ensures MRC GEM members are better equipped to support and operate within emergency management systems during disasters of all types and sizes.

MRC GEM Participates in the Region D Healthcare Coalition Exercise

Region D Healthcare Coalition held its annual medical response and chemical decontamination surge exercise at the GNR District Health Office in Lawrenceville. The four-hour event was hosted by Mark Reiswig and Lori Wood who presented a fictional chemical release scenario which engaged the team in discussions involving WebEoc db data entry, collaborative aid availability from each agency, and communication to and from the JIC. The 80+ participants were from many Region D agencies including Grady, Emory, metro-Atlanta county directors of emergency management, and other response organizations. Because the gathering was so large, the event was more of a group discussion where different agencies described their processes to maximize information distribution and improve response activities.

Steve Inserra and Tony Varamo represented MRC GEM and received education on how the WebEOC database works, how Region D is organized, and how emergency responders plan for events such as this. The event finished up with a "hot-wash" and lessons learned from the drill.

Region D Healthcare Coalition was established in 2012 and funded by the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR), the RDHC serves more than three and a half million citizens residing within eight metro-Atlanta counties: Clayton, DeKalb, Fayette, Forsyth, Fulton, Gwinnett, Newton, and Rockdale. Their purpose is to combine effective communication, strategic acquisition and management of resources, and collaborative prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery to apply a coordinated response to healthcare events that occur within the region.

Safety Tip: Change Your Voicemail in an Emergency

If you're ever lost while hiking, stranded with a broken-down car, or in a remote area with no signal and a low phone battery, this tip could help save your life:

Change your voicemail greeting to include your approximate location, time, date, your situation (lost, out of gas, injured, etc.), and any instructions (e.g., staying with the car or walking to town). Even if your phone dies, your voicemail will still work. Anyone calling you will hear your message and know how to help or where to send assistance.
